WEALTH IN NUMBERS (W.I.N.)

Wealth in Numbers (WIN) is a program developed by The BIPOC Alliance. The objective of WIN is to increase access to capital and resources available to BIPOC and businesses by leveraging the strengths within the northern Colorado BIPOC community.

The program aims to bridge the wealth gap and elevate, educate, and uplift members of the BIPOC community in northern Colorado.

GRANT AWARDS

The BIPOC Alliance is grateful to award grants to support the sustainability and growth of BIPOC-owned businesses in northern Colorado. Grants are awarded to business owners, entrepreneurs, and sole proprietors in the BIPOC community, self-identifying business needs. Funding can be used for needs such as COVID-19 relief, general overhead capital, payroll, marketing, etc. and is at the grantees discretion.







THE IMPACT

Freedom from ridgid application processes, severed barriers on who is eligible for funding, autonomy over how funding is used and no

intrusive and labor intensive reporting

requirements. Successful execution of grant funding model without barriers!

THE PROCESS

- Throughout October 32 applications received
- November 3 Application evaluation, due diligence and recommendations completed by Grants Team
- November 8 Grantee selection completed by Advisory Circle on N
- November 9 Grantee notified
- November 13 WIN Gratitude Brunch and Celebration!







Cultural Enrichment Center - \$5,000

Serving Black middle & high schoolers, funding will support a video production class, creating a documentary about the Black youth experience in Fort Collins.



Uno1, Dos2, Tres3 Español Without Stress - \$5.000

A collective of tutors elevating the Spanish language through fun & engaging Spanish classes for children and adults. Funding will support technology enhancements.

Stamps Appraisals, LLC - \$2,500

The only Black-owned real estate appraisal firm in northern Colorado, funding will upgrade technology to enhance sustainability.





Hispanic Women's Farming Proyecto - \$2,500
Proyecto provides Hispanic women, primarily
immigrants and refugees, education in agriculture &
business management. Funding supports the
women directly.

Luxelocksco now Sonder Salon - \$1,000

Funding supports the sustainability for this hair and alternative hair salon, primarily serving community members affected by hair loss.



Urban Monk Studios - \$1,000
Through the healing power of sound, this studio offers music instruction, featuring classes in guitar, banjo, voice, ukulele, performance, and jam classes. Funding will support musical instrument maintenance and administrative support.

Somewhere in La Mancha Farm - \$1,000

A private, raw milk dairy farm and community education & gathering center focused on connecting people in stewardship, to the land.

Funding supports a children's garden & classes.





Serving da Real T - \$1,000

Emerging real estate agent of color striving to develop generational wealth through BIPOC homeownership. Funding will enable liberatory outreach.

Clean House Co. - \$1,000

Due to the impacts of the pandemic and other challenges, funding will support franchising to ensure sustainability.


Nail Wizard, LLC.- \$1,000 Unique nail salon and lash studio seeking new signage to increase awareness, draw in more clients, and improve sustainability.

The Taco Stop - \$1,000

A local staple and home-grown resturant, this business experienced major impacts throughout the pandemic. Funding supports payroll and supporting the rising costs of food and supplies.

Cimarron Concrete, LLC - \$1,000

A new family-owned business provides concrete services to northern Colorado.
Funding supports marketing and start-up costs.





Fort Collins Complete Services - \$500

Providing financial literacy, translation, notary services, and consultation, funding will enhance technology to support more clients in self-sufficiency.

Brandon Basketball Academy - \$500

Three brothers offering basketball personal training and basketball camps to youth in NoCo. Funding supports new equipment for programming.

A sticker shop dedicated to de-stigmatizing mental health for the Latinx community through art.
